









Zozo Session 3

The following notes support and summarise Zozo's third online or school-based session, providing a summary, and indicating online video support materials and suggested lesson plans

Resources

Djembes, percussion instruments (claves, maracas, etc)

Vocabulary

Panlogo, Anansi, Trickster

Learning Objectives

Children should learn:

- the panlogo/logo call and response
- about Anansi the trickster in African traditional story
- the Jamaican proverb Old Time Story

Learning Outcomes

Children

- Perform the basic Panlogo pattern using voices, drums and other percussion instruments
- Devise and perform the Anansi/Maskita story using voices, instruments and movement
- Interpret the rhythms of Old Time Story as a rhythmic sequence using bass and open tones

Content of Zozo's third session

- 1. Revision of Maskita sequence (bass/open tones)
- 2. Story of Daisy and the trickster Anansi telling how Maskita came about
- 3. Introduction of Panlogo, a popular West African rhythm originating from Ghana
- 4. Old Time story African proverb and rhythm

Lesson Plans

First Access: African Songs and Drumbeats/Teachers/Lesson Plans

Zozo's **Maskita** story takes place at Carnival Time in the Caribbean. Daisy (an expert cook) is preparing food for everyone, but mosquitos keep spoiling it. She consults Anansi the trickster who hatches a plan to save the day.

Children could read and listen to other tales about Anansi. Anansi means 'spider', and he often appears as a spider in stories. Stories of Anansi reached the Caribbean during the Transatlantic slave trade. Zozo teaches his Anansi song in the additional video sent to schools in January 2020. This can also be found, along with a story, in the **African Stories** section of this online resource.

Maskita 2

Suggests ways of developing a melody for Maskita using the pentatonic scale and xylophone

Panlogo

Reinforces Panlogo pattern and suggests movement activities to reinforce this.

Old Time Story

Suggests activities for reinforcing and exploring the Old Time Story rhythm and explores ways of combining Maskita and Old Time Story patterns. Zozo develops this further in subsequent sessions
